

## Letter Maze


Spell RABBITS in the maze to help Chip find his litterbox and hay rack.




Since Ralph is in such good health and well trained, he helps train volunteer first responders how to help pets in disasters, such as hurricanes.




Amy keeps a first aid kit for Ralph and includes him in family emergency planning. She also has to maintain her barn, truck, and trailer for safety.


